# Should the American Marten be Introduced to the Pennsylvania Wilds? Program November 3<sup>rd</sup> at 7 pm at Blue Spruce Lodge

A small mammal has been missing from Pennsylvania forests for more than a century. The Pennsylvania Game Commission is considering bringing it back. The animal is the american marten, aka

the pine marten. It weighs two pounds and may reach two feet in length. Martens most closely resemble weasels, minks or fishers. The american marten disappeared in Pennsylvania around 1900 because of deforestation and over harvesting.

Tom Keller, a fur bearer biologist with the Pennsylvania Game Commission, will discuss the possible reintroduction of the american marten on Friday November 3rd, at 7 pm at Blue Spruce Lodge. This event is sponsored by Evergreen Conservancy. It's free and open to the public.

The game commission has yet to commit to the reintroduction of the american marten. They have been studying the issue since 2022. Martens like to live in forested areas where there is at least 35 inches of snow. Once approved martens would be introduced to the area known as "Pennsylvania Wilds" in north central. Martens are eaters of small animals like red squirrels, mice, birds, rabbits, fish, as well as grasses and berries. In states where martens live there is little impact on turkeys and grouse.

> Mr. Keller received a Bachelors in Wildlife and Fisheries Management from Penn State University, and a Masters in Conservation Biology from Green Mountain College. He has worked for the USDA Wildlife Services and the Game Commission. Currently he manages 16 fur-bearing species from weasels to coyotes.

> Keller's presentation will concentrate on the history of wildlife management in Pennsylvania, the loss of habitat and species in the state, and the rewilding in Pennsylvania.

Then he will discuss the feasibility of reintroducing the marten in Pennsylvania. He will also discuss marten biology.

Again, Keller will discuss the american marten on Friday November 3rd, at 7 pm at Blue Spruce Lodge. This presentation is free and open to the public.

## Grants

We submitted an application for an Indiana County Endowment grant to help support the costs involved with plant patrol projects in ridding the invasive plants in Indiana County. We are waiting to hear if we will receive the grant.

# Trash Clean Up at Blue Spruce Park Scheduled October 14

Evergreen Conservancy has scheduled a trash clean-up of the roads of Blue Spruce Park on Saturday October 14th, beginning at 9am. Volunteers are invited to participate.

Those who choose to volunteer should park in the lot nearest the park office. Everyone will be provided trash bags, gloves and orange vests. Some prefer to bring their own gloves.

The cleanup will involve Blue Spruce Road from Route 110 to the park office. It will also include the road through the park. Volunteers are reminded that Blue Spruce Road is heavily traveled – orange vests will be provided and appropriate signs will be posted. The cleanup will include some rough terrain and exposure to ticks.

Previous cleanups have taken less than two hours. Please dress appropriately if you plan to volunteer.



## **Presidential Volunteer Service Award Presentation**

On July 19th a special luncheon was held at Benjamin's Restaurant to honor Cindy Rogers for her volunteer work with numerous community organizations. Sara King, president of the Friends of White's Woods, presented Cindy with the 2023 Presidential Volunteer Service Award.

This award is a prestigious national honor in recognition of volunteer commitment that was established in 2003, and is given to individuals who have volunteered more than 500 hours over the course of a 12-month period. The award program is a way to thank and honor those individuals who inspire others to engage in volunteer service. The Friends of White's Woods became a certifying organization for the Presidential Service Award in 2022. TREX in return sends us a bench after we have collected 500 pounds of soft plastic.


