Evergreen Held a Great Educational Program About Bats at the End of October

Fifty-five people signed in. Many were elementary age (along with their parents). We had many more new people than "regulars", making the program a fine success.

Pennsylvania Game Commission Information and Education Specialist Chloe Kalp gave a very informative presentation to an enthusiastic audience.

White-nose syndrome is a fungal disease caused by the fungus Pseudogymnoascus destructans, which affects hibernating bats in North America, leading to significant population declines. It is characterized by a white fungal growth on the bats' muzzles and wings, and has resulted in millions of bat deaths since it was first identified in 2006.





PA Master Naturalist Program at ICCD 2026

The Indiana County Conservation District (ICCD) is excited to share an opportunity for individuals who love nature and community service. In Spring 2026, Pennsylvania Master Naturalist—a statewide nonprofit dedicated to training conservation-minded volunteers—will offer a new volunteer training course in Indiana County, in partnership with ICCD.

If you enjoy the outdoors, want to deepen your understanding of our natural world, or hope to make a meaningful local impact, this program is an excellent fit. The course runs April 1 to June 17, 2026, with weekly Wednesday evening classes (6-8:30) and four Saturday field sessions (April 11, May 2 & 16, June 3).

Trainees complete 50 hours of instruction, followed by 30 volunteer hours and 8 hours of continuing education to become certified. To maintain certification each year, volunteers complete 20 service hours and 12 education hours. There are many opportunities locally to earn these hours.

Geocaches

Have you ever been on a treasure hunt? Geocaching is the next best thing! Using GPS coordinates, you have access to thousands of sites that have hidden containers for you to find and record. Participants share these locations online, often swapping small trinkets or signing logbooks to document your adventure. Evergreen Conservancy has our own GeoTrail

that has a series of 20 geocaches all over Indiana County! A GeoTrail is a series of geocaches that center around a common theme. Our GeoTrail's theme focuses on areas of environmental interest in the county. Join in on the fun by picking up our official Indiana County Ecotour Geotrail Passport at these following locations around Indiana:

- Indiana County Tourist Bureau
- Blue Spruce Park Office
- Indiana Free Library
- Yellow Creek State Park Office
- Blairsville Community Development Authority
- Solar in Smicksburg Geocache Site

The passport has the sites' names, a place to list the code word you find, and a few questions you can answer after finding all the sites. Each of the 20 sites will bring you to a place in the county, exemplifying one of five themes: water, land, wildlife habitat, sustainability, and healthy community. In the cache, you will find information about the site and a code word that should be written in your passport. Once you've found all 20 caches and filled out all

20 code words, bring your passport to any participating location to receive your very own trackable Indiana County GeoCoin.

Data Logger Volunteers Needed!

Are you interested in water conservation and monitoring water quality? Evergreen is looking for data logger volunteers to help download data in the streams of Indiana County! Evergreen has 25 data logger sites that record parameters to help detect pollution events. Volunteers will go out and download data on a continual basis, then send the data to our AmeriCorps member. The data is uploaded to the Three Rivers Quest (3RQ) site at the West Virginia Water Research Institute. This project monitors streams and rivers that drain an area of over 25,000 square miles located

in five states. The data is used by the public, researchers, state & federal agencies, and industries to monitor the overall health of our local rivers and streams.

Volunteers typically go out to the stream to download data about once a month from spring to fall. We appreciate any amount of time you can contribute! Data Loggers - End of Year

The 2025 year for data loggers is slowly coming to an end. Our volunteers have been winding down this winter season by taking data loggers out of streams and storing equipment to brace for the cold. This project runs annually from spring to winter, giving us time to clean and standardize our data loggers before returning them to the streams next year. With 25 data loggers covering key streams in the Allegheny River Basin, we've recorded thousands of water quality entries during 2025. Thankfully, no major spills or pollution events to report!

2026 marks Evergreen Conservancy's 15th year of our Indiana

County Water Quality Monitoring Initiative. We're currently in the process of making a data logger map to display our 25 data logger locations and document the history of our efforts over the past decade. We plan to continue our dedication to keeping Indiana County's streams clean, which wouldn't be possible without the support of our members and the community. A huge thank you to our volunteers for the time and work they dedicate to helping Evergreen Conservancy with our conservation efforts. We look forward to another successful year in 2026, with more to come!
